Medieval mysteries Saturday 11 September

Get a flavour of medieval times with the opening of two special displays, storytelling for children and strolling Elizabethan musicians.

- What was life like in medieval 'Swindon'? **Re:Evolution**, a new exhibition created by the young people of Swindon Foyer, compares life over 600 years ago with modern times. *The exhibition runs from 11 September to 10 October, and is part of the 'Re:Evolution' project, supported by the Campaign for Learning and the Heritage Lottery Fund, in association with Museums and Foyers in the South West area.*
- See a display of local **medieval finds** by metal detector enthusiasts. *The display runs from 11 September to 31 October. In collaboration with members of the Wyvern Historical and Detector Society.*
- Be entertained by musicians in period dress from **Diabolus in Musica**, performing popular music from Elizabethan England. Between 10 am and 4 pm.
- Enjoy tales of medieval life with Michael O'Leary, Hagstone Story Teller. Regular sessions between 10.30 am and 4 pm. *Drop in activity.*

Holy Rood Church and The Lawn

What lies beneath? Saturday 11 September. 10 am - 4 pm

The medieval theme continues at The Lawn in Old Town, with a survey of the site of Swindon's original parish church, which dates back to the 12th Century, and possibly earlier.

- One of Britain's leading survey companies, Stratascan Ltd, will be giving demonstrations of how state-of-the-art geophysics techniques can be used to 'see below ground' and investigate buried archaeological remains, without disturbing the site. *Drop in activity.*
- Go back in time with members of the North Wiltshire Branch of the Young Archaeologists Club as they plot the original plan of the Church and 18th Century manor house 'The Lawn' on the grass, using old photographs and records. *Drop in activity.*

The remains of Holy Rood Church will also be open on Saturday 11 and Sunday 12 September, providing a unique opportunity to visit this little known historical site. There will also be exhibitions and displays about this 'secret' area of Swindon, throughout the weekend.

Lydiard House and Park
